## Henrico County Health District Clinical Services

The Henrico County Health Department (HCHD) provides clinical services at two locations in Henrico County – the East and the West locations. The East location is at 3810 Nine Mile Road in the Glen Echo Building, and the West location is at 8600 Dixon Powers Drive in the Human Services Building. Clinic hours at both locations are 8 AM through 4:30 PM Monday through Friday.

Figure 1 below shows the total number of patients seen by all clinical services offered at HCHD. Detailed data for each clinical service are shown by HCHD location and program in this issue. These data highlight the major clinical services and programs provided by the HCHD. All data presented are preliminary and subject to change, and represent unduplicated patient visits.

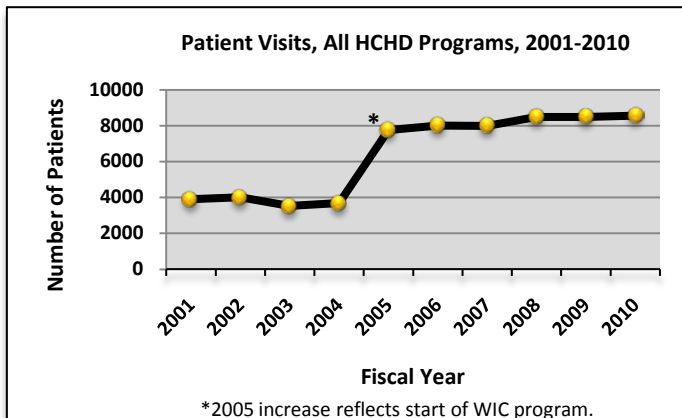

## Pediatric Clinic

Comprehensive developmentally appropriate health care, vaccinations, and anticipatory guidance for infants and children ages 2 weeks to 5 years of age are provided in the West Clinic. In collaboration with the Pediatric Residency program at the Medical College of Virginia/Virginia Commonwealth University (MCV/VCU), 341 patients received pediatric services at the HCHD during Fiscal Year (FY) 2010 (July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010) (Figure 2). Currently, the Pediatric Clinic is held on Monday mornings. To make an appointment at the Pediatric Clinic call 804.501.4651.

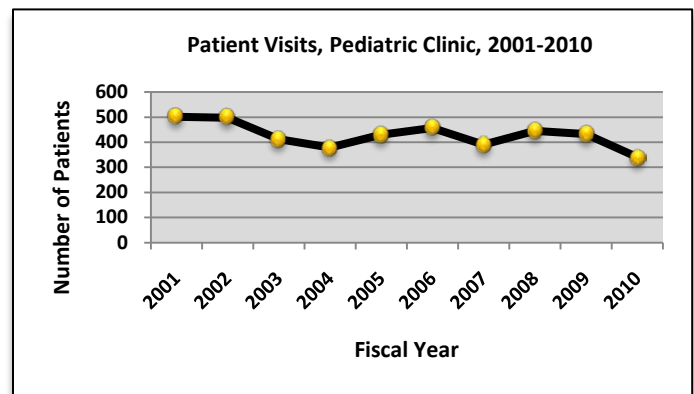

## Refugee Clinic

The Refugee Clinic provides initial health screenings for newly arrived refugees or other qualifying individuals (determined by the federal government). Services include a general health overview, tuberculosis screening and testing, blood work, stool screening for ova and parasites if indicated, and vaccinations. The number of individuals seen in Virginia is determined by the U.S. Office of Refugee Resettlement. Immediately following September 11, 2011, the number of refugees coming to Virginia declined, as reflected in the numbers seen at the HCHD (Figure 3). Currently, the Refugee Clinic is held Tuesday mornings with a follow up appointment on Thursday afternoons. 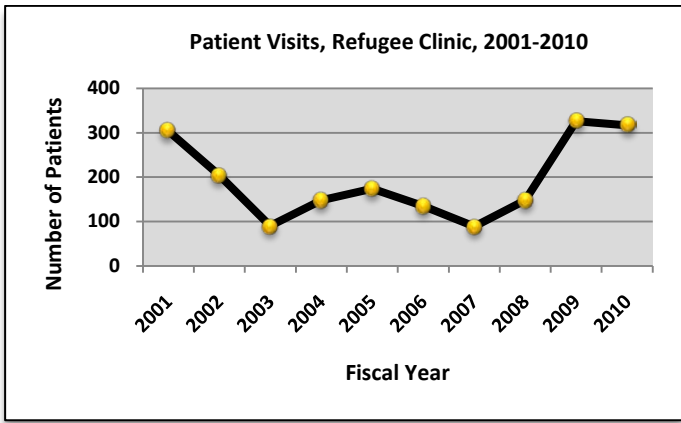

### Dental Clinic

The Dental Clinic provides dental care for children and adolescents. Children can be seen beginning at age 2½ years. The Dental Clinic provides the following services: routine preventive dental care, examinations, cleanings, x-rays, fillings, stainless crowns, extractions, pulpotomies, Headstart exams, fluoride treatments, dental sealants for school-age children, and dental education programs in schools and day care centers. From FY 2001 – FY 2010, an average of 1,051 children and adolescents per year received Dental services at the HCHD (Figure 4). The Dental Clinic is open all day Monday through Friday. To make an appointment at the Dental Clinic call 804.501.4658.

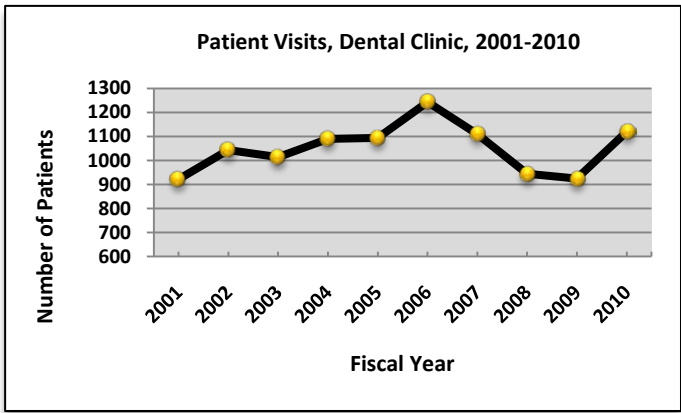

### AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP)

The ADAP is a federally funded, state managed program that provides medication for HIV-positive persons who do not have health insurance or prescription drug coverage who qualify medically and financially. As with 11 other states, Virginia currently has a waiting list for new clients except for those with special circumstances, such as pregnant women and children less than 18 years of age. New clients are primarily being referred to pharmaceutical patient assistant programs (PAPs) for medication. Henrico currently provides services for over 150 existing clients, which represents a decrease from approximately 200 clients in FY 2010 (Figure 5). 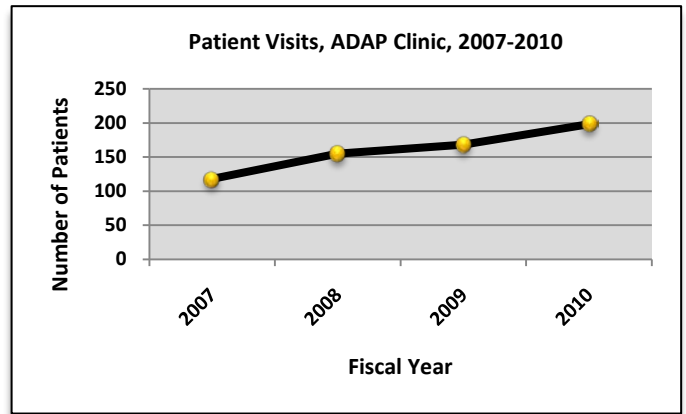

### Sexually Transmitted Disease (STD) Clinic

The STD clinic is a free confidential walk-in clinic that offers screening, counseling and treatment for HIV, syphilis, gonorrhea and chlamydia, herpes, genital warts, and other sexually transmitted infections. At this time screening is not offered for hepatitis B or hepatitis C. In FY 2010, 924 patients received STD services at the HCHD (Figure 6). The STD Clinic is held on Tuesdays at the East location; registration is on a first-come-first-served basis. To make an appointment at the STD Clinic call 804.652.3190.

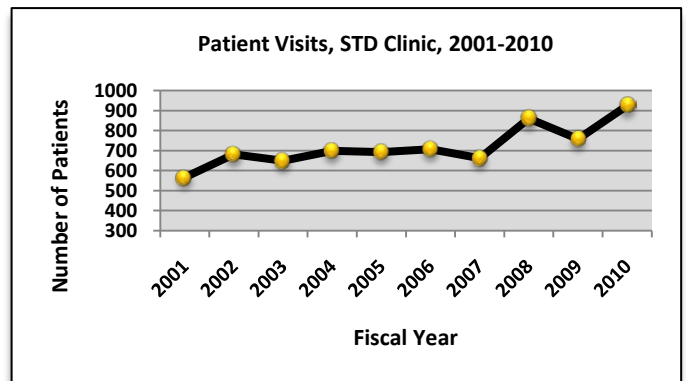

## Clinical Services Provided At Both the West and East Henrico Health Departments

### Maternity Clinic

Maternity services at both the East and West Clinics include comprehensive prenatal care for women with uncomplicated pregnancies. Women with high risk pregnancies are referred to high risk obstetric services at MCV/VCU or to other community obstetric practitioners. During FY 2010, 385 women received prenatal services at the HCHD (Figure 7). Since July 2010, an attending physician and residents from the Obstetrics and Gynecology Residency Program at MCV/VCU have provided maternity services at the HCHD in collaboration with HCHD nursing staff and nurse practitioners. Currently, Maternity Clinics are held in the East location on Wednesday morning and in the West location on Wednesday afternoon. 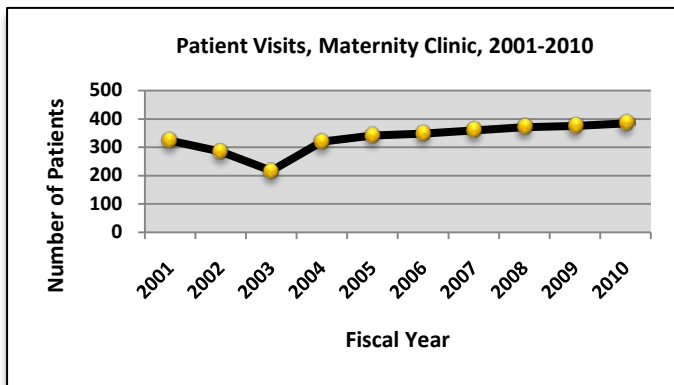

### Family Planning Clinic

The Family Planning program offers a variety of birth control methods to women including oral contraceptives, the Patch, the vaginal ring, and Depo Provera injections. From FY 2001 – FY 2010, an average of 1,082 women per year received Family Planning services at the HCHD (Figure 8). Currently, Family Planning Clinics are held in the East location on Thursday mornings and in the West location on Tuesday afternoons. To make an appointment at the Family Planning Clinic call 804.501.4651 (West) or 804.652.3190 (East).

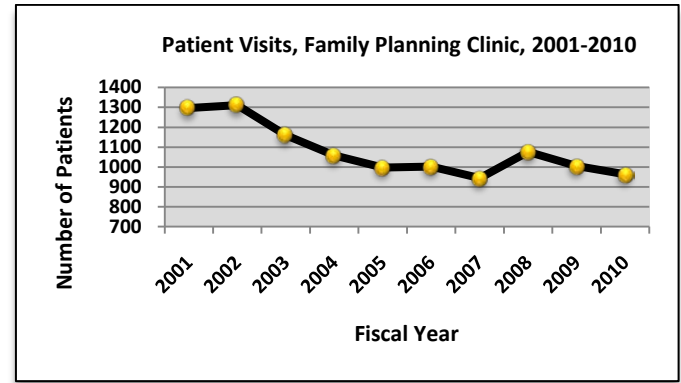

### Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) Program

WIC is a federally funded program that provides high-quality nutrition education and supplemental foods to participants. Nutrition education is provided to pregnant, breastfeeding and postpartum women, infants, and children under the age of five. WIC has a full-time lactation specialist, and two breastfeeding peer counselors that offer breastfeeding education and support. The program provides fruits, vegetables, whole grain bread, tortillas, soy milk, cow's milk, cheese, eggs, juice, cereal, dried beans or peas, and peanut butter. WIC also offers iron-fortified infant formula. In FY 2010, an average of 5,370 clients was served monthly at the HCHD (Figure 9). The WIC Program operates Monday-Friday 8 am - 4:30 pm. To make an appointment at the WIC Clinic call 804.501.4652 (West) or 804.652.3180 (East).

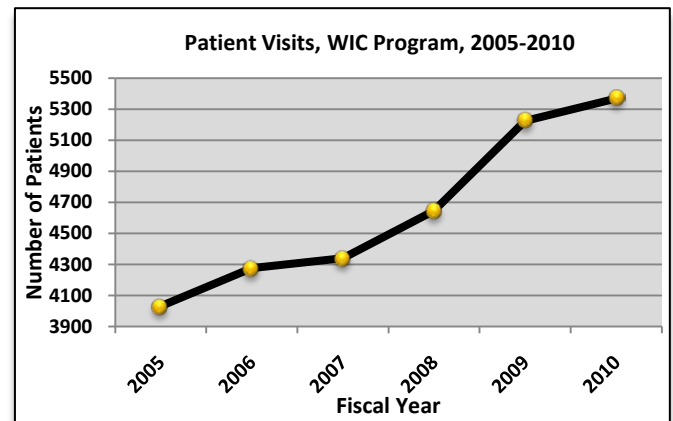
